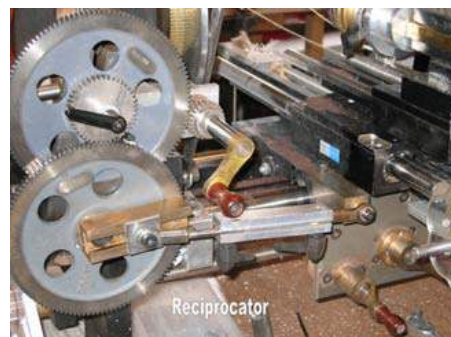
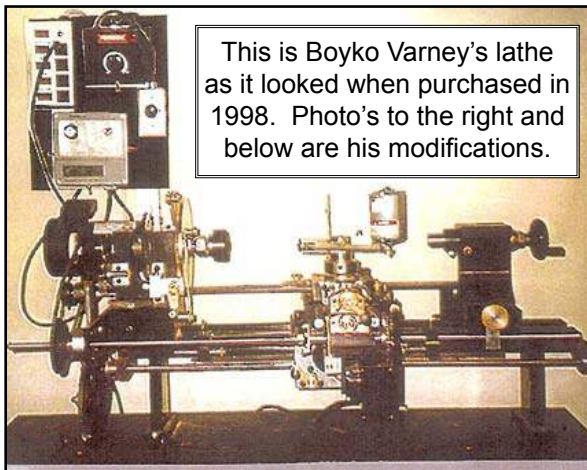
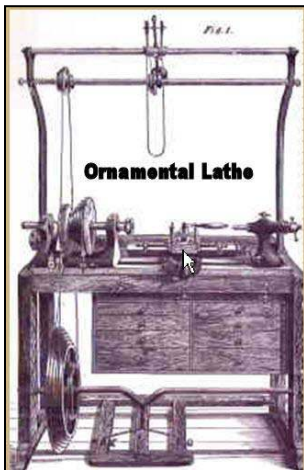
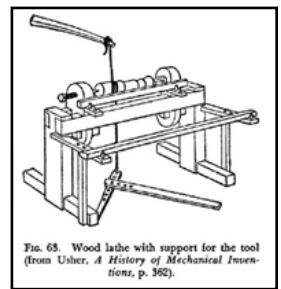
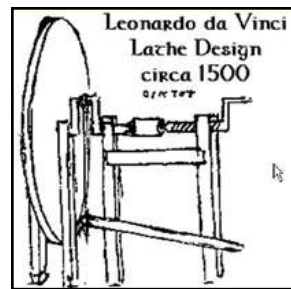
# May Program—Ornamental Woodturning

Boyko Varney presented a program on ornamental wood turning. He said that some people refer to ornamental wood turning as “carving on a lathe.” He gave us a brief history of the lathe which dates back thousands of years and presented slides along with his program. Some of his slides are included here. Varney has an ornamental lathe of his own which he purchased and then modified to suit his purposes. He built many of the parts of his lathe himself and his being an engineer helps with that, as the machine looks very complicated. A few items made on an ornamental lathe are pictured at the bottom of page 4 and are very well done and beautiful. He explained and demonstrated how his lathe works.
