

October Program - Carving Problem Night By: Paul Cast



- 1. **Paul Cast** Paul needs to know how to cut out a blank for a duck. He said he had never carved a duck and recently had to carve one. How do you cut out the blank with the head on it, or do you carve it separately. Several members gave answers but the general consensus was that:
 - a. For a full size duck it's best to cut the head separately and then glue the head onto the body.
 - b. If carving a miniature duck its fairly easy to cut out the blank with the head attached.
 - c. If you decide to cut out the head and body together it works better if the head is facing straight ahead.
- 2. **Jack Taylor** How to determine the distance a standing duck's legs should be set apart. Jack makes most of his duck standing so this distance is critical when placing the legs into the body.
 - a. Floyd Tinsley said that he had read that these distances would apply for placing the ducks legs. The legs should be set apart a distance equal to 2/3 of the overall width of the body. That would leave 1/6 the width of the body to the outside of each leg.
- 3. **Loren Moseley** Loren reported a problem that he was faced with when carving a Sandhill Crane. He solved his own problem and wanted to share it with the group. The crane has long spindly legs and Loren knew that the legs needed to be reinforced, otherwise there was no way the legs would support the weight of the body. So Loren started with a 1 inch by 1 inch piece of wood and drilled a hole through the middle. Then after carefully carving the legs around the drilled hole, he inserted a 3/16" steel rod for reinforcement. He said that he carved the feet from wood attached to the base which was of walnut.
- 4. **David McCool** David has started a relief carving in 1 inch basswood and the carving has cupped toward the carved side. David got several suggestions as to how to deal with this common problem.
 - a. Iron the back.
 - b. Dampen the carving and clamp it back to a flat surface and let dry.
 - c. Plane the back flat.
 - d. Leave as is and frame the carving.
 - e. Next time use quarter sawn wood.

Thanks to Linda Taylor for suggesting a problem solving night and to Paul for doing the program. Everyone seemed to find the discussion interesting and informative. Thanks also to all those who shared their problems and to those who offered suggestions for solving them!

Scouting

Paul Cast talked about our participation in the scouting event last month at Camp Naish, where we carved the totem pole. He said the folks at the camp were very happy with what we did. He said they were going to use a tractor to lift the red oak log back on the trailer but it was too heavy so they had to get another piece of equipment to handle it. He said the pole was 17 feet long and over 2 foot in diameter. He has put a first coat of finish over it and will be putting on several more.

The woodcarvers workshop is coming up November 20, 2010. They invite scouts from the council and they carve four different things while they are there. The woodcarvers who volunteer will sit, carve and talk with them. The scouts will get a carving knife, 3 slide blanks to carve and a coupon to get another blank out of the boxes of blanks. They get a band aid and a piece of sandpaper. This year they will be carving a "C", because it's the "100th Anniversary of Scouting". They will also be carving a running bear and a frog face. These are all neckerchief slides. Paul said that as of this meeting they had 25 scouts signed up but they expect several more. Last year there were about 42 that participated.

Paul said that he needs to get all the carvers that he can get to help with the event. This event as the last one, will be held at Camp Naish. Paul said that if you are volunteering, it's a good idea to carve these slides yourself prior to the event and bring them with you. That way you have experience with carving the item as well as having a sample for the scouts to look at and something to strive for. Paul had some blanks at the meeting to give out to those who could help so they could get familiarized with the carving prior to the event. Samples of those blanks and finished carvings made from them are pictured here.


