Each folder in the Artists' Files collection contains documentation of the artists in our community and may include artist statements, exhibition history, reviews, public collections and other documentation.

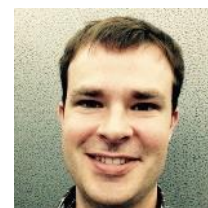

From The Shop

September will be another busy month for shop with Guild Open house on Saturday September 12th, Ben Hobbs chair class Monday September 21st through Thursday September 24th, the WIA dinner on September 26th, and David Mark's class Monday September 28th & 29th. It is important to check the Open Shop Schedule as open shop time will be canceled during these activities.

The Guild will see many new faces coming into our facility during this time it is important that WE put our best foot forward with a clean and orderly shop. Please plan to participate in the scheduled shop clean up before these events. Every member using the shop can help by spending a little extra time cleaning and pick-

ing up their area and machines before leaving. The scrap bin is not a trash can!! Please think about what you're putting in it. Could this material really be used? Or is it better suited for the trashcan.

Several times in the past month **band saws have been started before the tension handle was engaged.** Remember the first thing on the start-up checklist is "Is the tension ON?" Starting the saw with the tension not engaged can and most times will damage the blade and requiring its replacement. Questions on use? Ask the Shop Foreman on duty.

Have you checked tools and cords you use in your home shop? Check cords for abrasion and cracks of the outer jacket and

the strain relief where the cord enters the tool for damage. Check the plug for damage or missing ground prong. Replacing a damaged cord or plug might take a little time but it could save you from an electric shock or worse. Remember to check each tool's cord, plug, safety guards, switch function, and, if it's a new tool, the safety/instruction manual before use.

What is that Diamond Placard and What does it Mean?

Have you ever noticed this colorful diamond placard with numbers on it when you picked up a can of finish, or entered some buildings? This is a National Fire Protection Association, (NFPA) 704 placard. NFPA placards are signs that are diamond in shape, with four panels of different colors making up the body of the sign. Each color represents a different hazard (see diagram). Hazards are denoted in each of the 4 areas with a number (4 through 0) or a letter/symbol.

This placard exists on buildings for Fire fighters and other emergency personnel were entering buildings without any knowledge of the hazards present. The NFPA Placard was adopted to immediately alert emergency personnel to the hazards present. The Placard also assists a company to comply with the OSHA Hazard Communication standard. Around the shop, you will see the placard on cans of solvent and finish.

In Kansas City and other cities around the country, you will see the placard on all exterior business entrances. When quantities of chemicals are present anywhere inside the building, these placards are required by local ordinance. Look for the Diamond at an entrance to the shop next time you are there.

What do the four color quadrants represent?

Based on the chemical properties spelled out in the Safety Data Sheet (SDS), the diamond may have the following information:

Blue Panel – Health Hazards: This section indicates the hazard to **human health**.

Red Panel – Fire Hazards: This section indicates the **flammability** of the material stored.

Yellow Panel – Reactivity: This section indicates the **reactivity** of the material stored.

White Panel – **Special Precautions**: This section contains special instructions that pertain to the chemicals present, i.e. **W** indicates that water is not to be used as it will react with the chemicals present.

The numbers in each of the colored quadrants indicate the degree of hazard present for a category. A numbering system of zero to four is used denoting the severity of the hazard.

- 4 - A four indicates a severe hazard;**
- 3 - A three denotes a serious hazard;**
- 2 - A two denotes a moderate hazard;**
- 1 - A one denotes a slight hazard;**
- 0 - A zero denotes minimal hazard or no hazard.**

Now you know what that colorful diamond placard is and what the numbers mean the next time you see that diamond on a building or a can.

On-line Safety Test for KCWG Shop “Green Tag”

Today on-line testing is being used to evaluate skills for job openings at every rung of the career ladder from bank teller to executive level. To join this increasing trend, this month the KCWG is entering a new era with the Safety Orientation program, by moving to on-line testing. The requirements to receive a green safety name tag have not changed; just the manner in which the safety test is administered is changing.

In the last few months, a sub-team of the Safety Committee, headed by Jerry Stanley, has been reviewing companies and developing

procedures for this new on-line safety testing program. This new on-line testing program opens up a number of innovative methods to expand our program. We can add video, pictures, and new machine tests for everyone to take faster than we have in the past. According to Chuck Slagle, Director of Safety, This new testing method provides greater access and a better testing experience for our members. In addition we can expand our capabilities to provide video and pictures in the testing environment. I believe that we will be able to enhance our members learning experience.

A [Link](#) to the test will be located on the Guild web site, however, to be able to take the test it will require a password. The participant will be able to log on and off of the test over time, and know the results before arriving at the Safety Orientation. They will be able to receive a print-out of their score, and the questions, if they miss some questions, they bring it to the class.

As it is currently done, incorrect questions will be discussed with each participant to correct to one hundred percent.
