As a professional with the highest level of safety certification and acumen, and with the assistance of an outstanding Safety Committee, Chuck has led enumerable safety-related initiatives and developed a comprehensive Safety Program that has not only made the Kansas City Woodworkers' Guild a safer place to enjoy this wonderful craft, but has also created a model for similar organizations to admire and emulate. Thank you, Chuck!

On November 1, 2016, we incurred an injury accident in the Guild Hand Tool Room. A member was using a handsaw to separate his box lid from his box base while holding his work piece in his other hand. The result was a laceration to his left middle finger that required stitches to close. Now, allow me to seque to our new Safety Rules for the KCWG Shop handbook, which was developed through the Safety Committee by a sub-committee, led by **Bob Edsall**. Hand Tools

Compared to a lathe spinning at 4,000 RPM, hand tools may appear innocuous. And by and large, they are safer than power tools. Nevertheless, they can hurt, as anyone who has hit a thumb with a hammer or gashed a hand with a knife, can attest.

Safety rules

Use the right tool for the job and use it as it was designed to be used. Improvisation can lead to injury.

Make sure any edge tools you use - knives, chisels, carving tools, planes, etc. - are sharp. Dull edges require excessive force, and that can lead to accidents.

Carry pointed tools by your side with the points and heavy ends down.

with a vice or clamp.

Keep both hands behind the blade of a chisel or knife and out of the path of a saw. Don't cut toward any part of your body.

When you need to pull a knife to make a cut, make sure that you pull it to the side of your body.

Additionally, let me call out one more Shopwide rule that needs to be emphasized and clarified for all Shop users:

Wear safety glasses with side shields when the shop is in operation, wherever you are working, not just when you are using a machine vourself. Glasses should be ANSI 287.1 rated.

We hope to see Jamie's work in the shop soon.




