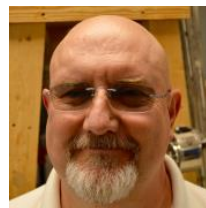

2016—Another Year of Growth

This past year we have broken the 700-member barrier. We are at 744 members - that is up from 628 in 2015, an 18% increase.

Once again it is time to renew your membership. If you renew before January 31, 2016 you will get a \$5 discount on your membership. And for those members who wish to belong to both the Woodworkers Guild and the Wood Turners club, you will get additional discounts worth \$10 (\$5 from each group). All memberships including those combining with the Wood Turners Club can

Remember that you need to renew by March 31st to maintain your Green Card (and to keep your spot on the "board"). Anyone renewing after March 31st will be considered a new member and will have to complete the safety requirements to use the shop.

Last year we had a large number of discount cards that were never picked up. Your new dis-

count cards will be in the membership office - they can be picked up at the monthly meeting or ask the Foreman on duty during any open shop.

If you notice something not working right, please tell the foreman on duty. We'll either rectify the situation or take the equipment out of service and notify the Assets Director.

Remember to use the dust collectors and, if the bag is nearing full, empty it for the next person. Please clean up after yourself (I've noticed messes around the hand tool benches, scroll saws, lathes, sanding equipment, and band saws that weren't cleaned up before the user left).

But mostly, be safe. Don't get in a hurry. Better to have to wrap an IOU than to take a sleigh

ride to the emergency room.

Focus on Safety...

Chuck Slagle has elected to step down from his position as KCWG Safety Director. I want to thank Chuck for his dedication to Safety at the Guild for the past ten years. As a professional with the highest level of safety certification and acumen, and with the assistance of an outstanding Safety Committee, Chuck has led enumerable safety-related initiatives and developed a comprehensive Safety Program that has not only made the Kansas City Woodworkers' Guild a safer place to enjoy this wonderful craft, but has also created a model for similar organizations to admire and emulate. Thank you, Chuck!

On November 1, 2016, we incurred an injury accident in the Guild Hand Tool Room. A member was using a handsaw to separate his box lid from his box base while holding his work piece in his other hand. The result was a laceration to his left middle finger that required stitches to close. Now, allow me to segue to our new *Safety Rules for the KCWG Shop* handbook, which was developed through the Safety Committee by a sub-committee, led by **Bob Edsall**. (This comprehensive document will replace the current machine safety

rule sheets.) A new element of our *Safety Rules* is focused on *Hand Tools*, excerpted here. Adherence to these Rules would likely have prevented the November 1 accident:

Hand Tools

Compared to a lathe spinning at 4,000 RPM, hand tools may appear innocuous. And by and large, they are safer than power tools. Nevertheless, they can hurt, as anyone who has hit a thumb with a hammer or gashed a hand with a knife, can attest.

Safety rules

Use the right tool for the job and use it as it was designed to be used. Improvisation can lead to injury.

Make sure any edge tools you use – knives, chisels, carving tools, planes, etc. – are sharp. Dull edges require excessive force, and that can lead to accidents.

Carry pointed tools by your side with the points and heavy ends down.

Whenever possible, secure your work piece with a vice or clamp.

Keep both hands behind the blade of a chisel or knife and out of the path of a saw. Don't cut toward any part of your body.

When you need to pull a knife to make a cut, make sure that you pull it to the side of your body.

Additionally, let me call out one more *Shop-wide* rule that needs to be emphasized and clarified for all Shop users:

Wear safety glasses with side shields when the shop is in operation, wherever you are working, not just when you are using a machine yourself. Glasses should be ANSI Z87.1 rated.

The handbook is currently being finalized for rollout in early 2017. Thanks for your Focus on Safety!
