

ecently ľve been working on some drum frames for Scout Camp. The wood is recycled from the council ring benches that were installed for the Camps 75th Anniversary 2004. in so there's a history



involved, although trying to get enough wood that was still in good shape was challenging.

The reason I bring this all up is that someone at the Guild mentioned they look like they would make a great planter. So if you want to



try to make a planter; cut 33 pieces 3" wide, each side is beveled at 5 1/2°. Then glue up the 33 pieces using a Super Strap (huge rubber band) available on Amazon/Smile. Attach 30" round plywood ends on each side, place pipe in the center and suspend the planter over a router with a spoil-board bit.

Then run the planter across the router to smooth the facets. Complete with exterior finish of vour choice Enjoy your new planter.



Her grandfather was a crop duster and apparently flew an airplane with wooden Propellors made by Culver Props. When the company decided to call it guits, he bought the



company and all the equipment, templates, and supplies in 1999, and moved it from Pennsylvania to his farm in Missouri. Unfortunately he died in an agricultural accident, but Alaina apparently learned enough about the work that she decided to keep the company going.

There is a lot more engineering and science about Propellors than I am familiar with, but they seem to do well and their Propellors are bought by pilots around the world.

According to the photos on their website, Culver Props, they do make a bunch for older aircraft, but they also make plenty for new experimental



airplanes. You would be wrong to think that their market is limited to antique airplanes. They also make Propellors for other aircraft including for filling



hot air balloons. Of course, they can also make decorative Propellors for hanging as art. They have participated at the annual Oshkosh Air Show for more than 30 which years. means that the

experimental aircraft community is familiar with them. too.

SAFETY THOUGHTS AND COMMENTS

Did you know that there are safety sheets for each piece of equipment posted in the shop on the wall close to the useable scrap wood bin? These sheets provide the safety rules to be



followed when in the shop. This month we will look at the band saws and highlight some of the key safety points.

The guild has several different band saws, be sure to use the right saw for your task.

A few of the Band Saw Safety Rules in no particular order...

- 1) Set the guide $\frac{1}{4}$ inch above the board being cut.
- 2) Allow the saw to reach full speed before starting to cut.
- Cut slowly so that you do not twist or overload the blade.
- Do not back out of long cuts unless the blade is at a dead stop.

- 5) Stock being cut must lay flat on the table to avoid pinching the blade.
- 6) Fingers must be always kept at least 3 inches from the blade.
- No part of your body should be placed across the line of the saw.
- B) Do not stand to the right side of the saw. If the blade breaks it may fly out in that direction.
- 9) Always use a V-block when cutting round stock.
- 10) Always use relief cuts when cutting curves.
- 11) If the blade breaks:1) stand back,2) shut off the power3) tell the shop foreman.
- 12) Do not use fingers to remove scrap while the blade is moving.
- 13) To control stock use push sticks, feather boards or any other safety device when cutting small or short stock.
- 14) Turn off the band saw and wait until it comes to a complete stop. Never stick an object into the blade to stop the machine quicker. Let it stop on its own.



Two final things to remember

Situational awareness: be aware of what is happening around you in terms of where you are, where you are supposed to be, and whether anyone or anything around you is a potential threat to your safety

Clean up the band saw area when you are done. Dust collection on the band saws is not the most effective. Grab a bench brush, a broom & dustpan and do a quick sweep. A clean shop is a safer shop.

FROM THE SHOP - SUPERMAN STRENGTH NOT NEEDED

The saying goes "Tight is Right" and you certainly don't want your router bit coming loose or your drill bit falling out, But come on! Overtightening

fasteners, handwheels and knobs on tools is not necessary. Overtightening results in worn/ stripped threads, damaged collets, broken parts and very annoyed mere mortals that can't loosen the results of your superhuman strength. Maybe the tools on your home planet can withstand the force you imart but here on earth with our yellow sun we just aren't accustomed to your power. Now I'm not saying that tightening is bad, on the contrary, there is

a proper level of tightness for tools to perform well. I think you would be surprised at how much less than all you can muster that is.

A related issue is not considering that the force needed to turn a handwheel or make an adjustment. It may be that the part is clamped or locked in place and needs to be released and NOT a call to summon your inner Hulk and power your way through. Your adversaries are soft brass, plastic and brittle cast parts, they will yield to your will. That yielding comes at a price in both replacement parts and machine downtime. I beg of you to show us mercy, I can get you some coal and

JUNE MACHINE SAFETY REVIEW

CNC Router

The CNC router is a computercontrolled cutting machine used for various hard materials such as wood, to create a decorative design on or the functional shape of a workpiece. CNC stands for computer numerical control.

- 1. In addition to safety glasses with side shields, hearing protection is required in the CNC Shop area.
- 2. Ensure that your workpiece is secured to the CNC table.



- Ensure that all clamps used to secure the workpiece to the CNC table are out of the cutting area or the tool path.
- 4. Do not leave the CNC machine unattended while it is routing the workpiece.
- 5. Use only sharp bits free of rust and pitch to avoid excess friction. A dull or dirty bit could result in the workpiece coming apart and causing damage to the equipment or the operator.
- 6. Always use the wrenches provided with the CNC machine during set-up and when making adjustments during the routing of the workpiece.
- 7. After changing the bits or making any adjustments, ensure that the collet nut is tightened securely.



Description:

Joseph Moxon first discussed this popular woodworking device in book "Mechanick his Exercises" in 1677. This is where the first drawings of the device were displayed. However. the actual design may predate this publication by many years.

This tool is basically a double screw clamp that holds boards vertically for the purpose of making joints by hand. It is either built into the workbench or is a separate tool that can be moved out of your way when not in use.

Moxon Vises can be found in several variations and are used in many forms of woodworking. It is common to see them being used for cutting dovetails and in chair making projects.

Join Chuck Saunders as he leads this class in building a Moxon Vice that each class participant will add to their tool arsonal and will then be able to be used and enjoyed for generations.
