

CHANGES ARE COMING TO THE PROJECT STORAGE RENTAL AREA

Phere's a few changes in the works regarding the storage area. First, we're going to combine the rental payment with membership renewal. Jim Berard will be sending out the usual email at the end of the year notifying people it's time to renew. At that time, payment for the storage rental will be due also.

MEANWHILE, there's a lot of wood stacked randomly here and there throughout the storage area. It's messy, it's a hazard, and it ain't fair to the people who pay for a labeled storage bin.

So. If you are one of those who have wood stacked here or there, please label it by November 30, or request more time (email, call or text me). Wood not claimed will be cleared - given away, trashed, used.... (If you have wood in a labeled/paid for shelf, no worries). Put a label with your NAME and CONTACT INFO - either phone or email. Something you actually check. If we cannot contact you by renewal time, that wood will be cleared given away trashed or used...you get the idea.

Once everything is labeled and accounted for, you'll be notified what the rental fee will be (similar to what is currently charged for the shelving areas), and that will be due when the membership renewal dues are collected.

Project Storage

FROM THE SHOP

Poday's topic is the Widebelt Sander. The first thing to notice is that I called it the widebelt sander, not the widebelt planer or widebelt jointer. The machine is used for sanding wide pieces of wood to a uniform surface. Much like the hand sanders, the widebelt sander is a finishing process tool, designed to remove small amounts of material to achieve a finished surface.

Why do I bring this up you ask? I feel that some may see the sanders as a way to flatten a roughsawn

> slab that is too wide for the jointer. They are willing to spend hours wearing down the face of their slab a few

thousands of an inch at a time. In the case of the TimeSaver tving up the Foreman for that time as well. Not to mention that while you have the desire to haul around a 500 pound monolithic plank, the Foreman does not, so bring additional labor to help with the hauling around. The Foreman, while helping you with the operation of the machine, must also be watching the rest of the shop and needs to be able to attend to issues at a moment's notice.

So, what are you telling me Chuck, that I can only sand glass smooth pieces? Well, no, but think more leveling glue up misalignment (after scraping off excess glue of course) than hand hewn timbers. Planks and assemblies that are topographically interesting should be leveled by other methods before progressing to the widebelt sanders. Methods like the scrub plane or power planer will knock down the high spots while the plank is resting comfortably on a bench. The plane is easier to haul around than the plank and think how old world craftsmen

like you will feel. You might even want to start singing shanties or something.

LASER ENGRAVER SIG



At the time of writing this article the Laser Engraver has been down for a week. Parts were ordered and were supposed to be delivered Friday but there were some problems, and the part didn't get shipped out until Friday to arrive by Monday, which it didn't arrive. So verifying shipment and obtaining a tracking number it was to arrive sometime Tuesday.

This time it was a proximity sensor, "which rarely goes out" per RabbitLaser USA. At the SIG someone asked why don't we keep spare parts, so we don't have to wait for shipments? #1 this part was still under warranty. If we buy extra parts, we will need a separate room just to hold spare parts and the costs would be on us instead of warranty. Additionally, what parts would we expect to need replacing? We have an extra lens, but it becomes expensive. This time it was no one's fault, computers/ electronics (especially from China) can fail.

The September SIG we discussed where to find, how to adapt, and made some Halloween Decorations. In October we plan to show and

make some Thanksgiving Decorations. In November we plan to show and make some Christmas or Hanukkah decorations. As

always, we offer Engraver Laser training following the SIG meeting. This month trained four.



Speaking of Christmas, Santa's Workshop and Holiday Gift Mart, November 19 & 20 needs trained Laser Engravers to custom engrave the toy trucks the kids make. Jon Lunde pointed out that the wheels could be an issue and after a trial run, we found he was correct. Thanks Jon! So, we will have the assembler elves only attach one wheel to each axle, the LE SIG folks will custom engrave the truck and help attach the second wheel to complete the toy trucks. We will have a jig set up with a prepared design, all the LE trained folks need to do is place the truck in the jig, let the kids type their name in the computer design, send the file to the laser engraver, and push the start button. BUT we need LE trained folks to sign up, PLEASE.

23rd from 2pm to 4pm at the KCWG shop for the Handtool SIG. Last month we covered the basics of sharpening straight blades like handplanes and chisels. This month we are going to look at card scrapers and scraper planes!

Learn to efficiently sharpen a card scraper and how effective they can be in most any material. Got tear-out in your white oak? Scrape it! Got some epoxy filled knots in your hickory? Scrape them flat! Got troublesome grain in your curly cherry? Scrape it to tame it!

And maybe you've got a larger area to work? Perhaps an entire table top



Consider a scraping plane such as the venable Stanley #80. Or step up to a Stanley #12 or #212 or the modern interpretations! Give that hammer it down in a bath of hide glue and elbow grease!

Be there Sunday, October 23rd from 2pm to 4pm at the Kansas City Woodworkers' Guild shop and see how easy it is to set up a scraper. And as always, the Open Shop will close at 2pm to resume again at 4pm.

The Guild's financial position remains strong. Year-to-date revenue exceeds budget projections and expenses are below budget. The Guild will end 2022 with an increase in the revenue reserve. Interest rates in the six CD'S are also on the rise which has not happened in years.

Monthly Statements of Operation are available in the members only section of the web site and can ve viewed by clicking here: https://member.kcwg.org/wp-content/uploads/FS22-03.pdf These statements will provide you with more detail on the revenue and expenses for each month.

As we wind down this year it is time to start thinking about 2023 and that starts with the budget. October is the beginning of the budget process. We plan to have the budget completed by the first week in December and then finalizing plans in January. This is your opportunity for suggestions and recommendations for the coming year. If you have an idea or need, please let anyone on the leadership committee know so that your ideas can be considered during the budget process. Your input is important and always welcomed.

Changes are also coming to the method used

to pay for classes. The timeline has not been established nor has the exact procedure been finalized. You will be notified prior to the change.

Membership dues will not increase for 2023 but there will be a 20% increase in storage area fees. If you have wood stored at the Guild make sure the area is marked with your name and email. This includes wood that is standing along the wall. An email will be sent at membership renewal time notifying storage owners of the amount due.

This is also time for you to consider becoming more active in the administration of the Guild during the coming year. There are always jobs that need to be managed and the more members that are involved the easier it is to spread the workload. If you are interested, please contact any member of the leadership committee, and get involved.

SEPTEMBER MACHINE SAFETY REVIEW

Table Saw

Table saws are designed to rip, crosscut, and cut bevels and angles with precision.

Safety Rules

- Always use the fence, crosscut sled or miter gauge. Never cut free-hand on the table saw.
- 2. Use the blade guard for all crosscut and rip operations except when using the crosscut sled or when ripping workpieces too narrow to fit a push stick between the



- guard and the fence, in which case replace the guard with the riving knife.When cutting with the crosscut sled, use the riving knife, and make sure the outfeed table guide slots are aligned with the saw-table slots.
- 4. Position your body to the left of the blade so that it is not In line with the "kickback alley."
- 5. When you crosscut multiple pieces to the same short length, use a stop block clamped to the rip fence as your reference point. Using the fence together with the miter gauge or crosscut sled without a stop block risks kickback.
- 6. Do not reach over the blade until the blade has stopped completely.
- 7. Keep the tips of the blade teeth only 1/8" to 1/4" above the stock.
- 8. Never operate a table saw with the throat insert removed. Use a zero-clearance insert when appropriate.
- 9. Keep the area in back of you free of people in case of kickback. Be careful not to put pressure on the workpiece in a way that would press it against the side of the blade or pinch closed the kerf made by the blade.
- 10. Use a push stick to rip stock that is too narrow for you to keep your hand 3" from the blade while cutting it.
- 11. Make sure that the blade has stopped turning completely before you remove scrap pieces from the table or adjust for another operation.



Description: Building your project is 90% of the work. The other 10% is putting on a good finish. One of the biggest challenges in achieving a good finish is choosing the finish you want for your project. To help you, Craig Arnold will be teaching

a finishing class in three fast-paced sessions that will provide you with experience finishing a variety of woods, finishing materials, and processes.

This is a fast-paced class. Students will learn techniques

for finishing woods: quarter sawn white oak, red oak, walnut, cherry, mahogany, curly maple, pine.

The "finish" includes surface preparation to final rub out. The class will use penetrating oils, sealers, grain fillers, and shellac. Also, they will use dye stains, pigment stains, and glazes for layered color.

Students will use water-based stains and topcoats and oil-based stains and topcoats and will learn when to use either. Milk paint and chalk paint will also be used.

Participants will learn brushing, wiping, and spraying topcoats. Waxes and finish rub out will conclude the class. Students will keep their sample boards as a reference for their future projects.

Expected Skills: Students are expected to be able to hold a paint brush and a rag. No power tools will be used in this class.
