Anyone with an interest in learning to use the CNC is welcome to join us. We will meet at 6:30pm Tuesday January 17 in the Guild Library.







SAFETY THOUGHTS AND TIPS

With so many new woodworkers joining the Guild each month, it is important to reinforce the things that may seem like common sense to an



experienced woodworker. Even experienced woodworkers can always use a refresher on these key safety attitudes. This month's safety newsletter is taken from the guilds website shot safety tips.

- **FOCUS** A good safety attitude means that you focus on the task. How well are you concentrating on the job? If you have other things on your mind, you may be distracted.
- **STRENGTH** No, this does not mean muscle strength. What it means is the strength to do the right thing, even when you are under time or other pressure to take shortcuts. A good safety attitude means you have the strength to follow the safety procedures.
- **TIME** A good safety attitude means taking the time to do things correctly and using the right guard or Personal Protective Equipment (PPE). Is saving a few minutes worth a lifelong injury?
- **RESPONSIBILITY** If you care about yourself and your family, YOU will have to take responsibility and follow the safety procedures and not take short cuts.
- **RISK** We all take risks. A good safety attitude means being smart and avoid taking unnecessary risks. A one in a thousand risk is not worth the

possible cost. Do not play the odds, always follow the safety procedures.

Recommended Personal Protective Equipment

- **Hearing protection:** Select earmuffs that have a 25 or higher NRR (Noise Reduction Rating). Earmuffs are more comfortable than earplugs, and they make donning and doffing easier. Ear protection with radio/bluetooth is not allowed.
- **Dust protection**: A good choice is a half-mask respirator, such as 3M's 6500 Series Respirator with their 2097 P100 Particulate Filters.
- Eye protection: Safety glasses must be ANSI (American National Standards Institute) Z87.1 rated and include side shield protection. Safety glasses must be worn at all times you are in the shop while power equipment is being used.

Slips, Trips and Fall Prevention

- Keep the floor around power equipment clean and free of scrap material, sawdust, oil, wax and grease. Clean the floors often and pick up items to avoid slips, trips or falls.
- Place cords and vacuum hoses out of the path of travel.

Safety Tips

• Before operating any power equipment, remove all loose clothing and roll up your sleeves above the elbows and tie back long hair.




- DO NOT WEAR GLOVES when using rotating or reciprocating machines.
- Always wear shoes that cover the top of your

feet and toes to avoid foot injuries.

- Give your work your undivided attention. Looking around, carrying on a conversation and "horseplay" are careless acts that can result in serious iniurv.
- Keep the machine guards in place at all times. If the guards are removed for maintenance or any special reasons make sure that



• DO NOT over reach. Maintain a balanced stance at all times, so that you do not fall or lean against blades or other moving parts. Always position yourself with the kick back zone in mind.



precaution to protect yourself and others around you.

- Always keep your hands and fingers away from blades, rotating parts, pinch points, electrical plugs, and 3" rule. Use push sticks, hold-downs and feather boards when possible. Use suitable support if the stock does not have a flat surface. Make sure all material is held firmly on the table and against any fence. If the stock is wider than 3", the operator's hand generally has more control than a push stick.
- Never remove small cut-offs, chips or scrap that lie next to any rotating blade or cutter until the blade or cutter has come to

a COMPLETE stop.

time. While suggestions were appreciated, most were considered long before Saturday.



Many suggested pre-engraving the design and adding the custom name when the kids get there, problem is you can never realign the piece. This is true with any engraving you create. Even with a jig once moved, you can rarely get a design

realigned to add something or even make a second pass. This is because you may want the engraving darker or the board just didn't cut all the way through.

By the way, the Santa's Workshop design only took 32 seconds to engrave. Once the process was refined, each one only took about 45 seconds to complete.

After repeated requests, we have established color (layer) 26 as the basic "Engraving" setting AND color (layer) 27 as "Cut Out." When




using these settings, turn off the "default" button within the settings window and be sure to turn on those "default" switches before closing the LightBurn software. These will be for users to start out, then they can refine the settings (changing layer color) to fit the needs of their project.



We had another fire destroying the laser pointer. We've taken advantage of the down time to do some clean up and took the grid, collection pan, and dust collection covers to the car wash to clean them up. Parts have been replaced and everything is in working order again.

There are "Sticky Notes" on the desktop of the laser engraver computer. These are meant to convey important current information, so please read them before utilizing the laser engraver and DO NOT close them. The LightBurn software will launch right over them.

DECEMBER MACHINE SAFETY REVIEW

Belt Thickness Sanders

These sanders are similar to thickness planers in that they remove material from the upper surface of a board. However, instead of using a series of rotating knives and shaving the material, they use a sandpaper belt to abrade it. The sanding medium spins above the workpiece, which feeds past it on a conveyer belt.

Safety Rules

- Use these machines to sand only workpieces 6" long or longer. Shorter workpieces cannot be safely supported as they pass through the machine.
- Check the integrity of the conveyor belt and sanding medium before turning the machine on. Any ripped belts or burn marks should be reported to the shop foreman.



- 3. Set the depth (with the sander and conveyor OFF) so that the abrasive is in contact with the workpiece just firmly enough that you can still pull the workpiece free. Do not attempt to remove large quantities of material in a single pass.
- Start the conveyor at 50% of its full speed, adjusting up or down in small increments to improve the quality of the sanding.
- Beware of getting your hand caught between the sanding medium and the conveyor belt when the machine is operating; serious injury could result.
- Push the workpiece from the in-feed side until the belt catches it. Remove your hands and let the conveyor belt feed the material through the machine.
- 7. Stand to the side of the machine while sanding to avoid kickback.
- 8. Avoid feeding more than one piece through the sander at once. Gangfeeding material may result in kickback. A proper cut is achieved by balancing the depth of cut with the feed rate, keeping in mind the qualities of the material being sanded. A soft wood can have a greater depth of cut and rate of feed than a hard wood.
