Happy New Year's, Everyone. I hope everyone had a great holiday season and that you're ready for another year of woodworking fun. I thought we should begin with a few refreshers about our wonderful Training staff and how to schedule a class.

#1: If you want to take a class from the Guild, it all starts with membership. If you want to become a member our Director of Membership, James Berard, can get you going. Jim can get you set up with everything to get you started on your woodworking life. <u>https://</u> kcwg.org/join-kcwg-now/

#2: Safety is paramount to your journey. Once you've purchased your membership the next step is complete your safety requirements. This will begin with completing your Safety test. This is an open book test that requires a 90% score and your signature on the Liability Waiver. At this point you have two options. First choice is to take the **Safety Orientation** class that happens once a month every month.

The second option is to participate in one of the **"Rough to Ready"** classes offered by the Guild. These classes offer a hands-on chance to learn how to operate each machine. This class will cost you \$50 for a Sawdust Maker membership or \$40 for a Woodworker Plus membership. **Please remember you can not take a class before completing your Safety Requirements.**

#3: Classes will be posted on Tuesday evenings at 7pm. They are a"first come, first served". So if there is a class you want to take watch for it on Tuesday evenings.

#4: Our Training staff enjoys helping you with all your dreams of a woodworking **life**. But please remember, we are a volunteer organization.

Okay, that should cover some of the basics. Now for some new news. The second session of the Basic Woodworking class will be posted on February 13th, 2024, as will the Hand Tool Woodworking class. These classes will begin April 4th, 2024. So keep your eyes open for these classes.

THE AV CLUB IS LOOKING FOR YOUR HELP

With moving to the new shop, I have been thinking alot about the future of the AV for meetings, trainings, and more. But I can not do it alone.

There are a few key roles that I have come up with and most require little or no previous technical experience at all. But they are all vital to make the audio and visual experience for our

meetings better. Both online and in person. If you think you could help in any of these positions, PLEASE let me know. I will make a signup sheet for the meetings in future but would really like to have a core group of volunteers.

VAMS: (Voice Activated Microphone Stand) 2-5 volunteers per meeting

This position requires the least technical skill but is probably one of the most important positions for our online audience. You will walk around with a microphone and when someone has a question, hand them the microphone so we can all hear the question.

Camera Operator: 1 volunteer per meeting (hopefully eventually we will add a second camera)

This position requires a little bit of skill but is easily taught and will have radio communication with the Video Producer

Sound Operator: 1 volunteer per meeting

This position requires a little more skill but is easily taught. You will be in the AV Booth watching the VAMS for questions and turning their microphones on/off, monitoring the person's speaking level and adjusting the microphone level. And balancing the volume levels for the meeting room.

YouTube/Facebook Live Chat Moderator: 1 volunteer per meeting


This position requires some computer skills and will be in the AV Booth watching the presentation on YouTube and Facebook and monitoring the live chat, asking questions from the chat to the presenter, and recording the time stamps of events to bookmark the video later.

Video Producer: 1 volunteer per meeting

This position probably requires the most skill and experience but it can be taught. You will be in direct radio communication with the Camera Operator to get the best camera angles, selecting stationary camera shots, operating the Pan Tilt Zoom camera (overhead camera), running any additional media such as photos, PowerPoint, or previously recorded videos



JANUARY MACHINE SAFETY REVIEW

Band Saw

The Band Saw has a thin blade in the form of a continuous loop. It is useful for cutting curves, resawing, and cutting thick material.

Safety Rules

- 1. Before turning on the band saw, make sure that the blade tension lever is in the "On" position and that the blade tracks in the center of the wheel treads when you rotate the wheels by hand.
- The teeth of the band saw blade should 2. point down toward the table.
- The blade should be 1/32" from the roller 3. bearing behind the blade.
- Make sure that the upper and lower 4. wheel guard doors are closed when the saw is running.
- Keep the blade guard only 1/4" above 5. your stock, or as low as possible if you need to clear the fence.



- Keep bystanders away from the right 6. hand area of the saw. Broken blades have a tendency to fly out to the right.
- Don't cut stock that is not flat on the bottom without holding it in a jig. Use a 7. "V" block when cutting cylindrical stock.
- Keep your fingers and hands away from the path of the blade. Never use 8. your thumbs to push your workpiece toward the blade.
- 9. Turn the machine off and wait for the blade to stop before backing out of a cut.
- 10. When cutting small or short stock, use push sticks, feather boards, or other appropriate safety devices to control the workpiece.
- 11. Do not force a cut. Allow the blade to dictate the rate of cutting.
- 12. If the blade breaks, shut the machine off and stand clear until everything stops.
- 13. When cutting with the table at an angle, clamp a block to the table to keep your stock from slipping off.
- 14. Never stick an object into the blade to stop the machine. Let it stop on its own or use the brake, if the saw has one.
