

Tow! What a crazy month it has been. If you missed the February membership meeting





THE DUMPSTER...ITS ALL ABOUT THE BIM BAMBOO

the code.

You may have discovered that the dumpster I outside is a bit difficult to use if you are trying to hold the lid open and dump a garbage can into it. It could take two people to do it successfully. On the other hand, I discovered that I could flip the top over more easily by using a long pole. To that end, I have placed a fairly long bamboo pole inside that you can use to flip the lid open when you take out the trash. I am putting a rubber tip on the pole because the hard bamboo slips too much against the inside of the lid otherwise. It's still doable, but the resistance of the rubber will make it more friendly to use.

Assuming that you will be using the pole, please return it inside the shop where you found it so that everyone will have access to it. Do not leave it outside. I have written "Dumpster Lid Lifter" on the pole to identify it.

This pertains to all members using the shop and not

just to the foremen. If you see that the sawdust is filling a can or there are cans full of pieces of wood or paper or other trash, then just help everyone else by taking out the trash. It is not inherently the duty of the foreman to empty the trash. In fact, when I'm the foreman, I will ask you to empty the sawdust bin when you are finished joining or planning your lumber if I see that the can is filling up. I won't wait till it is full because then it is too heavy to lift and dump into the dumpster by yourself. By the way, you should know the button code to get back into the shop if you want to use that door. It is definitely the most accessible door when you are dragging a garbage bin, but the code is regularly changed. The foreman should probably know



MESSAGE FROM OUR NEW SAFETY DIRECTOR

reetings to my KCWG friends and associates! My name is Steve Hicks and I have recently accepted the position of Safety Director for the Guild. Since this is my introductory contribution

> to the newsletter, I thought it might be helpful to share a little about my background.

I joined the KCWG in July 2019. I was immediately impressed with the sense of community exhibited by the membership. I especially appreciate the culture of support, guidance, and mentoring that is shared so many KCWG members. I have benefitted immensely from what others have shared with me.

Μų professional life entailed a 40-year career in occupational health &

safety programming for private industry (primarily in the manufacturing sector). During The last 7.5 years of my career, I focused primarily on evaluating and controlling workplace health exposures (e.g., worker exposure to harmful particulates, vapors, gases, biological agents, and potentially harmful energies such as excessive noise, heat stress, and radiation). I retired from professional service in December of 2023, so a new plateau of freedom to create, connect, and contribute is now opening to me. It is pretty exciting! It is also gratifying for me to know that I can try to lean into my knowledge and experience to help ensure that the KCWG continues to enjoy a strong safety culture.

Although the guild is guite different than workplaces in private industry (which fall under a comprehensive set of Federal Health & Safety standards, the standards, and practices that I learned and promoted over my career will inform my leadership in the Safety Director role. First and foremost, the KCWG places priority on providing a safe and healthful space in which we can all create and perfect our craft. I believe the stature and reputation of the guild deserves nothing less than our best effort.

As I step into this new role, my sense is that some of the initial priorities we need to focus on include the following:

- Revitalizing the KCWG Safety Committee so that we can build a robust core of safety champions to provide input on and communication of the overall message of safe work practices. We will be looking for committed members to join the committee and share their passion in promoting a safe and healthful workspace. If you are interested in joining, please reach out to me.
- Review and update written safety policies and procedures to ensure that they reflect our current set of machines and power tools and our new facility.
- Continue to build on the guild's rich tradition of safety-related training, safety orientations, and safety-related shop tutorials such as Rough-to-Ready. We want to continue to leverage the experience and zeal of those who wish to lead and teach through these specialized avenues.
- Shore up "procedural mechanisms" that will allow all KCWG members to report or escalate health & safety concerns to the Safety Committee or to me. Every one of us needs to have confidence our voices are heard, and that guild leadership and members will take responsive action to address issues and concerns that are raised.

I look forward to getting to know more guild members and doing what I can to help make

everyone's creative experiences at the KCWG to be the best they can be!!



FROM THE SHOP

We're lost, but we're making good time. Well it's not all that bad and we are making steady improvement

to the shop but there are just a lot of little things to attend to. Nametags are up so look for yours today! The Member Storage area now has shelving in place and Susan Lawlor is sorting who goes where. A reminder that if you do not have a space in the member storage area,

you have to take your project home with you. There will be no impromptu storing your things in some nook or cranny in the shop. Each night a team of seasoned squatter hunters will scour the shop and any self created storage contents will be transferred to the scrap bin. So don't self store or get to the shop early the next morning to get your stuff out of the scrap bin. Beware that the squatter hunters are also

incurable wood hoarders so it is possible that your ill stored goods may never see the scrap bin. Best not to tempt the fates and take your stuff with you, please.

Parking is a lot better here at the new shop. Be cautious as the spaces seem a little on the smaller size so watch when you back out. We are trying to address how others use our lot and it will help if you park in the lot and leave the street parking for those we encourage to not use our lot. In general the lot on the south side of the building is for us to park in while the lot on the east side is for our neighbors employees and their delivery vans. Evenings and weekends the east lot is fine to park in.

Getting into the building is easy as can be. Of course the

expected standard way to enter the shop is through the front door (on Washington St). Hey, we're not ashamed of you, you're a member, come in the front door. If, on the other hand, you have more than a couple of boards to bring in it may be easier to bring them in through the door on the east side (facing Broadway). Parking is kinda tight on this side so please unload and then move your car to the south lot. There is also a loading door at the loading dock (who woulda thought?).

One thing hasn't changed, Safety is still everyone's responsibility. Wear your safety glasses at all times during Open Shop. No gloves, open toe shoes or pressure treated wood are allowed. Don't rush. don't push beyond your comfort zone, don't risk it. Ask a Foreman for help or advice. Treat the tools with respect and be as sharp as they are. It's better to be "Johnny come lately" than "the late Johnny".

I hope to see you in the shop.

Photos Courtesy Neal Ray Shoger here and How to Begin Woodworking I first caught the woodworking bug from my grandfather, who was an avid retiree woodworker, but I didn't keep at it. After taking shop class in Junior High and High School (back when schools still had shop class), I moved on with my life. It wasn't until 2016, when I was in my fifties, that the woodworking bug

struck me again. Not surprisingly, I found that I had forgotten much of what I might have once known. That's what brought me to the Kansas City Woodworkers' Guild, and I have found the knowledge contained within the guild invaluable.

I'm pleased to announce that David Kraatz has developed a brand-new class for the newbie woodworker: *The Where and How to Begin Woodworking*. This class is not for beginning or novice woodworkers. Instead, it is designed for absolute newbies (or for ones like I was in 2016 who had been away from woodworking for quite some time). In the class, Dave will cover such fundamentals as reading a tape measure, using an adjustable square, making a cut-list, choosing material for a project, and much more. Best of all, the class is free! It will be held on March 30th, and the sign-up is already available.

I think this will be a fantastic opportunity for those new to woodworking. I just know how much I could have used such a class back in 2016. It would have saved me from learning quite a bit through trial-and-error.

In addition to Where and How to Begin Woodworking, the training department continues to offer its popular Basic Woodworking class that meets for ten weeks. The second session of this class starts on April $4^{\rm th}$, but the registration, including the



waitlist, is already full. There will, however, be a third session this year. That class starts on June 20th and the enrollment will open April 30th (at approximately 7 p.m.).

Besides classes, there are also the monthly Skill Builder sessions that are offered on the first Saturday of each month. In March, Tom Smoller from Papa's Workshop instructed us on how to carve a Newport shell. If you didn't get a chance to see this session, it's available on the Guild's YouTube page (youtube.com/@KansasCityWoodworkersGuild).

Here's where we could use some help from you. As I said at the start, I have found a wealth of woodworking knowledge at the guild. If there is something that you'd like to share for a Skill Builder, please let the training department know. On the other hand, if there is something that you'd like to see presented in the Skill Builder sessions, let us know that as well. at Training can be reached traininggroup@kcwg.net.

There's lots of opportunities at the shop these days. It's a good time to be a member of the guild!

WOOD IDENTIFICATION FOR THE COMMON WOODWORKER

fairly common question that we all have is about identifying what species of wood we are looking at. I get that often enough at the Guild. Just because I studied forestry and that included being able to identify woods, does not mean that I can look at a piece of rough sawn lumber and definitively identify it. I can usually tell you a bunch of species that it is not, and that is a beginning, but that does not always satisfy the desire to know which species it is for certain.

I recently discovered a book and a website that helps a lot and if the system is working well at the Guild on our meeting night, I'll attempt to take you through it to show you how to identify woods. I can tell you right now that to positively identify a piece of wood it requires that the end grain be nearly perfectly clear and it almost always requires magnification with at least a 10x lens to see what you need to see. I find that using my iPhone camera works well, assuming that the end grain is perfectly cut.

Looking at the larger flat surface works for some species, especially if the board includes the heartwood. Walnut can fool you if you only have the sapwood, for example. Color can help for darker wood species, but the lighter colors can be very difficult to differentiate and most species that we use are of the lighter colors.

Positively identifying woods is a science and it requires great conditions, especially of the end grain, so, even with this great website and book, you may still not know the species unless you had the complete provenance of the board from the tree to the shop. On the other hand, what I plan to show you will get you pretty close and enable you to identify woods on your own assuming that you are

able to prepare the specimen adequately.

I'm looking forward to showing you this handy tool and I hope to see you at the meeting.

CNC SIG ROUNDUP

CNC SPECIAL INTEREST GROUP (SIG) WILL MEET ON THE 3RD MONDAY OF EACH MONTH AT 5:30 PM IN 2024

Since the move to the new Guild building the CNC has been out of service for replacement of the horizontal table as well as replacement of some of the damaged T-Tracks. This has been a long process for both Bob Detwiler and myself.

By the time the newsletter is published the large CNC should be back in service. For those who use the CNC please take precautions to prevent damage to the new table. Double check your depth of cut and your toolpath to make your bits do not contact anything other than your project blank.

On another note, the Guild has access to free design software for the CNC. You can obtain a copy of the software by sending a request to cNCSIG@KCWG.net. This software will allow Guild members to learn the software and design their project at home. The Guild member then will bring their design to the Guild on a thumb drive (USB) and download it to the Guilds computer. From this they can then generate the code the CNC uses to machine their project.

Obtaining the software is a two-step process.

sure

First: Send your request for the software to CNCSIG@KCWG.net and you will then receive an email response with instructions to configure your software. The instructions must be followed to configure your software so that it will mesh with the Guilds master copy of the software.

Second: The instructions also tell you how to actually obtain the software. When you receive your invitation from Vectric follow the instructions from the email and you should be up and running.

This two-step process is necessary because I would have Vectric send the invitation to join the Makerspace, but members were not following the directions in the instruction email, and in some cases not even opening the instruction email. The end result was that the member could not load their design into the Guild computer. The Guild member would then need to uninstall the program and reinstall a new copy and configure it appropriately.

The CNC SIG will meet at 6:30pm on March 18 at the Guild (1717 Washington Kansas City, MO). A

"Show and Tell" time is planned to allow members to show and discuss projects they have that involved using the CNC. There will also be a time for questions about the CNC, the software and the CNC process. Also planned is a presentation about some online resources that will allow the members to learn the software and the operation of the machine. All members and their guest are welcome.



STORAGE, STORAGE AND MORE STORAGE



Hello all - I finally have an update regarding personal storage at the Guild. There are enough bins for current storage holders, and after those are assigned, I'll send out info to others who might be interested. I'll be randomly assigning the first batch of spots within the week (today's the 5th).

Based on simple math of dividing the square footage price for the storage area by the number of bins, the price for the calendar year will be \$108 a year (\$9 a month. Quite a bargain), which will be prorated accordingly.

The bins are 49-1/2" wide, 42" deep and 24" high.

And, the wall spaces - I'm still trying to figure that out, because that space is limited. So I'm starting with this: IF YOU HAVE A ROLLING CART - I think there's 5 or 6 of you maybe - LET ME KNOW, AND I WILL COME UP WITH PARKING SPOTS FOR THEM. Otherwise, hang on - I'll be asking you later if you want floor space. I have some other stuff to get done first, and will be doing this in stages.

And of course, remember: NO STORING OF WOOD ANYWHERE BUT YOUR PERSONAL RENTAL SPACE. It's messy, it's a hazard, and it ain't fair to the people who pay for a labeled storage bin. I will take a certain amount of glee, I must admit, in nipping that selfish foolishness in the bud. Wood left laying around WITH NO NAME ON IT will be discarded.

Speaking of which, if you DO need to leave wood somewhere for a limited period of time, or you have a bigger project or whatever, please put your name on it AND contact me, and I will try to figure something out so you don't get busted. We are all in this endeavor together, after all.

Ok? One last thing: Projects, materials and tools belonging to Guild members are stored at the owner's risk. The Guild assumes no liability for any loss or damage due to fire, flood or theft.

Groovy? Questions, let me know. I'll be assigning the bins to returning storage people very soon, everyone else asap after that.


MARCH MACHINE SAFETY REVIEW

Table Saw

Table saws are designed to rip, crosscut, and cut bevels and angles with precision.

Safety Rules

- Always use the fence, crosscut sled or miter gauge. Never cut free-hand on the table saw.
- Use the blade guard for all crosscut and rip operations except when using the crosscut sled or when ripping workpieces
 - sled or when ripping workpieces too narrow to fit a push stick between the guard and the fence, in which case replace the guard with the riving knife.



- 4. Position your body to the left of the blade so that it is not In line with the "kickback alley."
- 5. When you crosscut multiple pieces to the same short length, use a stop block clamped to the rip fence as your reference point. Using the fence together with the miter gauge or crosscut sled without a stop block risks kickback.
- 6. Do not reach over the blade until the blade has stopped completely.
- 7. Keep the tips of the blade teeth only 1/8" to 1/4" above the stock.
- 8. Never operate a table saw with the throat insert removed. Use a zero-clearance insert when appropriate.
- 9. Keep the area in back of you free of people in case of kickback. Be careful not to put pressure on the workpiece in a way that would press it against the side of the blade or pinch closed the kerf made by the blade.
- 10. Use a push stick to rip stock that is too narrow for you to keep your hand 3" from the blade while cutting it.
- 11. Make sure that the blade has stopped turning completely before you remove scrap pieces from the table or adjust for another operation.
